




lipside Burgers & Bar's menu crowns the customer the king of customizability; it's filled to the brim with create-your-own burgers and hot dogs, "upon request" substitution choices and an abundance of sandwiches and small plate options. The restaurant's recent renovations also underscore the message that the customer's experience is paramount. "We've been here almost six years, increasing business every year," says owner Mike Baffa. "It was time to put a little back into the place, finish the things I never got to finish."

Recent 2015 Best of Gold Coast award wins for Best Happy Hour and Best Hamburger are proof that Baffa gives his customers what they want. But how does he concoct all those burger variations?

"I may go to dinner somewhere and see something I really like," he says. "My goal is: 'How do we fit it on a bun? How do we get a bowl of pho into a hamburger?"" With that in mind, Flipside's famed Candy Popper Burger—a burger topped with cream cheese, candied bacon and a sweet carrot-jalapeño slaw on a pretzel bun-now makes sense. Baffa had been longing for jalapeño poppers when a light bulb went off.



To enjoy Flipside's award-winning burgers on the lighter side, try a gluten-free bun, order sliders or order the burger as a salad. Otherwise, try the veggie patty made inhouse with polenta, celery, corn, peppers, onions and sundried tomato.

To beat the heat, pair your burger with a summer drink. The Candy Popper Burger, for example, is just as spicy as it is savory, so good luck finding a better pairing than the Cucumber Honey Margarita. The drink's refreshing sweetness levels out the burger's peppery kick. It's so new that it isn't listed on the drinks menu yet, though you're more than welcome to order it now.

The Goat Burger features goat cheese, sundried tomato, caramelized onions and a honey-balsamic glaze. The salty-sweet tang is quintessential summer, especially when

partnered with the Mango Mojito. Take this meal to the patio and catch some rays.

Opposites attract in love, so take that adage to your plate. The salty-sweet Blue Burger, an unconventional combination of Gorgonzola, caramelized onions and apricot chutney, is greatly enhanced by sipping a Ginger Gold Rush Martini.

Baffa is proud of his limit-pushing menus. "We have twenty-five specialty burgers," he says, "and we make everything here, except the ketchup, mayo and ice cream."

Not in the mood for a burger? Fear not. Flipside serves fantastic sandwiches (the BBQ Jack Chicken wheat wrap with pepper jack cheese, bacon, fried zucchini and ranch is spectacular), and salads, like the Flipside Salad, with candied walnuts, dried cranberries, Gorgonzola and balsamic vinaigrette, satisfy even hearty appetites.

Whatever you do, don't skip out on the appetizers. The Pickle Basket, for example, contains fried pickles sliced thin as potato chips and topped with a deep-fried pickled egg. The Shrimp and Posole (a corn dish akin to polenta) Torta, with tomatillo slaw, salsa verde and chipotle aioli is a taste bud

blockbuster, and the Glazed Calamari, tossed in a blackberry-jalapeño glaze with chopped banana peppers, is worth writing home about.

Flipside is renowned for its happy hour and daily drink specials, but the quality of its cuisine, across the board, has been a well-kept secret. Oops. The secret's out.









## A Close Shave


he Westport Weston Family YMCA hosted TeamBrent's eleventh annual St. Baldrick's event. Almost 200 heads were shaved, raising \$185,000 to fight childhood cancer. The event included twenty-eight kids, ages three to seventeen. Of St. Baldrick's 500,000 global participants, less than 1 percent are Knights of the Bald Table (participating for seven years), but 25 percent of this year's TeamBrent participants were Knights; 33 percent were first-timers. 


